	<b>A</b>	<b>Alfa</b>	I have divers down there, keep clear!
	<b>B</b>	<b>Bravo</b>	Transport dangerous goods
	<b>C</b>	<b>Charlie</b>	Yes
	<b>D</b>	<b>Delta</b>	Maneuvering restricted, keep clear
	<b>E</b>	<b>Echo</b>	Change course to starboard
	<b>F</b>	<b>Foxtrot</b>	Unable to maneuver, contact
	<b>G</b>	<b>Golf</b>	Need pilots
	<b>H</b>	<b>Hotel</b>	Have pilots on board
	<b>I</b>	<b>India</b>	Change course to port side
	<b>J</b>	<b>Juliett</b>	Fire on board, keep clear!
	<b>K</b>	<b>Kilo</b>	Would like to get in touch
	<b>L</b>	<b>Lima</b>	Bring the vehicle to a stop
	<b>M</b>	<b>Mike</b>	Machine stopped, not driving
	<b>N</b>	<b>November</b>	No
	<b>O</b>	<b>Oscar</b>	Man overboard!
	<b>P</b>	<b>Papa</b>	Nets stuck on obstacle
	<b>Q</b>	<b>Quebec</b>	Everyone on board is healthy
	<b>R</b>	<b>Romeo</b>	No meaning as a single flag
	<b>S</b>	<b>Sierra</b>	My machine is running backwards
	<b>T</b>	<b>Tango</b>	When team fishing, keep clear!
	<b>U</b>	<b>Uniform</b>	You are in danger!
	<b>V</b>	<b>Victor</b>	Need help!
	<b>W</b>	<b>Whiskey</b>	Need medical help!
	<b>X</b>	<b>X-Ray</b>	Abort maneuver, pay attention to signals
	<b>Y</b>	<b>Yankee</b>	Drift at anchor
	<b>Z</b>	<b>Zulu</b>	Set nets / Need tugs
